UNITED WAY OF DANE COUNTY KICKS OFF THE 2022 COMMUNITY CAMPAIGN AT THE MADISON MALLARDS DUCK POND

Madison, WI (August 24, 2021) – Yesterday, United Way of Dane County officially launched the 2022 Community Campaign with a fun-filled Community Kickoff event at the Madison Mallards Duck Pond! Nearly 400 volunteers joined us for an afternoon of family-friendly activities, empowering them to learn more about our community’s needs and work together to make a difference. The group packed more than 2,000 paper product packs, which will be distributed to our nonprofit partners at Community Action Coalition for South Central Wisconsin, Middleton Outreach Ministry, The River Food Pantry and Second Harvest Foodbank. Through this hard work and these partnerships, we’re able to provide real, local families with resources they need to lead healthy, thriving lives – building well-being across the community.

“It was so great to be back in-person at the Mallards stadium after a few very challenging years – especially since we’re also celebrating our Centennial!” Shared Renee Moe, President & CEO of United Way of Dane County. “The energy on the field was contagious, and we can’t wait to keep that momentum moving.”

During the event program, we announced this year’s fundraising goal of \$18.4 million. Built by analyzing community data, understanding the community’s greatest needs and leading conversations with hundreds of business and community leaders, this goal is a \$300k increase over last year’s.

“We’ve got a big goal this year, but we’re optimistic we can reach it,” says Jeff Keebler, Chairman, President and CEO of MGE; United Way 2022 Campaign Chair. “By working together, we can achieve meaningful, measurable change! So, we’re asking everyone to give, in any way they can. There’s truly no other organization that centers families and works across sectors the way that United Way does. Together, we can help launch United Way of Dane County into the next century of impact and innovation.”

In 2021, United Way saw a successful campaign, raising \$18.1 million. Those funds are currently changing lives at 112 local programs and 52 local nonprofits working in partnership to address our greatest needs in education, income and health, and the needs of both children and their caregivers through 2gen (multigenerational) programming. An additional 850 nonprofits are supported through donor choice, as well as United Way 211 and volunteer resource hubs.
