# Bader Philanthropies Launches Innovative Leadership Development Program and

### Announces 2024-2026 Inaugural Bader Leadership Institute Fellows

MILWAUKEE-(October 15, 2024) – Since 1992, Bader Philanthropies has committed over \$500 million in organizations addressing major social needs throughout Milwaukee, the state of Wisconsin, and the world through grants and program related investments. Today, the Foundation announced the official launch of the Bader Leadership Institute (BLI), a comprehensive leadership development program, designed to empower emerging leaders in Milwaukee through a dynamic three-phase approach. BLI is led by Brandon Wigley, who was appointed to the position of BLI Director in June 2023.

BLI aims to foster personal growth, enhance organizational effectiveness, and strengthen community ties among participants through three phases over 21+ months.

#### Phase One: Monthly Sessions

Beginning this month, Bader Fellows will engage in a series of monthly sessions that explore essential leadership qualities and their connections to philanthropy and effective problem-solving. Participants will work in small groups to select nonprofit organizations and develop strategies to achieve goals.

## • Phase Two: Project Implementation

Teams will implement their strategies in partnership with the chosen nonprofits. This hands-on experience will provide Bader Fellows with leadership skills while delivering benefits to local organizations. Upon completion, participants will graduate and gain access to an alumni network.

#### • Phase Three: Alumni Network

Bader Fellow alumni will remain connected through an active network, utilizing their new knowledge and skills to address ongoing community challenges. Collaborating with Bader Philanthropies and other leaders, alumni will continue their commitment to driving positive change in Milwaukee.
